Please consider donating the use of your original artwork for CASA of New Hampshire's annual fundraising program, CASA Cards for a Cause. The proceeds raised from selling these packaged cards remains in New Hampshire to help defray the costs of the important work of the CASA program. Your artwork, if selected by the CASA card committee, will be part of a series of greeting cards available for purchase on the CASA website. This is a great opportunity for you to use your talent to support a valuable organization.

Selection Guidelines

- Artwork should be 4.75" x 6.25" (.pdf or .jpg) or able to be scaled to these proportions.
- Watercolors, acrylics, oil, pastels, photographs, graphic arts and drawings will be considered.
- All ages are welcome!
- Colorful children's art, any seasonal pieces, NH motifs, religious holiday, birthday, thank you, and sympathy ideas will all be considered.
- Up to three (3) pieces per artist will be accepted for review.
- During the review stage we only accept digital files or good quality color copies: i.e. color photos or color laser copies.

If your piece is chosen...

- We will ask for original artwork if needed to make the best quality image.
- Your name and town will appear on each card. You have the option to add a website or social media handles as well.
- You retain full copyright of your artwork. CASA asks to use your design on brochures and cards for the entirety of the CASA Cards for a Cause program.
- You are invited to participate in our Artist Spotlight where we interview all of our artists and promote any portfolios or businesses.
- Previously published artwork (e.g., children's book illustrations) will be considered if you provide appropriate copyright permission.
