Your artwork, if selected by the CASA card committee, will be part of a series of greeting cards available for purchase on the CASA website. This is a great opportunity to use your talent to support a valuable organization.

Selection Guidelines

- Artwork should be 4.75" x 6.25" (.pdf or .jpg) or able to be scaled to these proportions.
- Watercolors, acrylics, oil, pastels, photographs, graphic arts and drawings will be considered.
- Artists of all ages are encouraged to participate!
- Consider submitting vibrant children's art, New Hampshire landscapes, or themes for holidays, birthdays, thank-you notes, and sympathy cards. Designs for holidays and winter are particularly popular!
- During the review process, we only accept digital files or high-quality color copies.

If your piece is chosen...

- Your name and town will appear on the back of each card. You have the option to add a website or social media handles as well.
- You retain full copyright of your artwork. CASA asks to use your design on cards and in card marketing for the entirety of the CASA Cards for a Cause program.
- You are invited to participate in our Artist Spotlight where we interview all of our artists and promote any portfolios or businesses.
- Previously published artwork (e.g., children's book illustrations) will be considered if you provide appropriate copyright permission.

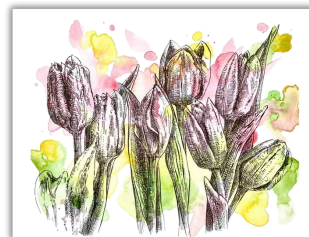
